



The Calvin Jubilee at Montreat, July 8-11, 2009, will be a festive occasion in which Christians from various denominations in the Reformed tradition will gather to worship, hear from some of the country's top Calvin scholars, participate in panel discussions, and otherwise celebrate the legacy of John Calvin. Lecturers will invite us into the richness of Calvin's theology, exploring his understanding of the triune God's glory as it is evident in the beauty of creation, the gift of the Bible, the promise of God's care, the worship of God's people, and the mission of the church. The Jubilee will also feature a joyous "birthday celebration" dinner, historical and book displays, round-table discussions with the speakers, and worship services that incorporate Calvin's approach to the liturgy.
