

**PRIMARY HEALTH**

- 21 health clinics saw approx. 200,000 patients, treating more than 289,000 cases in camps and host communities
- 5,983 women received ante/post-natal care
- Health & nutrition training for 60 health workers (care for victims of gender-based violence, leprosy and management of childhood diseases)
- 284 health workers & civilians trained in areas of health care & nutrition education (health worker trainings focused on prevention & treatment of sexually transmitted diseases & malaria)

**NORWEGIAN CHURCH AID**

**HYGIENE PROMOTION**

- More than 11,500 individuals trained in good hygiene practices
- 72 members of staff from DERO & two other NGOs trained in diarrhea prevention & control
- Hygiene kits (soap, storage containers, jugs) distributed to 13 schools and 3,147 recipients
- 26 health-awareness workshops focusing on personal & food hygiene, water handling, use of latrines

**NUTRITION**

- Supplementary food provided for more than 44,825 malnourished children under 5 & pregnant & lactating women – more than 80 percent of cases cured
- 108 people treated for severe malnutrition through outpatient therapeutic program
- 89.43 metric tons of food delivered to 14 supplementary feeding centers for distribution
- 12 nutrition teams operated at 15 sites in South and West Darfur



At SUDO's community center in Jebel Marra, a group of men have been trained how to make shoes. Initially, SUDO provided the materials, but now they are providing the materials and providing for themselves: "We work and get some money from what we sell — which is also good for the camp as our shoes are cheaper than those from the market" says Ousman. "Now we are busy we can forget all the bad experiences" adds Yusef.

# 2006 Response

## WATER AND SANITATION

- 63 boreholes drilled (7 rehabilitated)
- 4 shallow wells dug (2 rehabilitated)
- 71 new hand pumps installed (50 rehabilitated) to provide clean water
- Block latrines constructed in 16 group locations — clinics, women's center, market; more than 51 school & pit latrines constructed
- 170 new household latrines; more than 2,000 rehabilitated
- 15 locations sprayed with insecticide; 28 cleaning campaigns to limit the spread of disease by pests; 18,000 households benefited from insecticide



## AGRICULTURE

- Distributed seeds to 3,005 farming families for planting during the winter season; 350 rakes distributed
- Farmers trained in how to store seeds and create seed banks
- Pumps and insecticide have given to agricultural committees to protect the crops from pests



## EMERGENCY RESPONSE UNIT

- Essential household items (such as bedding, mosquito nets, plastic sheets) and hygiene kits distributed to 2,273 households
- Water cans, cooking utensils, mosquito nets, bedding and cooking sets distributed in El Dhein & Manawashei town

## EDUCATION

- One temporary school built; 3 semi-permanent & 3 permanent classrooms and 2 teachers' rooms built at 2 schools; 10 schools weatherized; new roofs for 3 schools
- School materials distributed to 19 schools, 5 adult education centers, and more than 16,000 pupils
- School administration training: for more than 135 headmasters, deputies, others

## PROTECTION, PSYCHOSOCIAL AND PEACE-BUILDING

- 9 community centers in camps provided trauma counseling services
- Handcrafts, sewing, and food-preparation activities to facilitate group counseling, social reintegration and small income generation continued in 11 community centers
- Community building activities included displaced people and host



communities and helped to build confidence and enable people to initiate solutions to common problems. Two children's galas, a recreation and peace day and a traditional culture day involved 1,132 people; other activities included bicycle races, football matches, horse races and exchange visits.

## Trainings

- More than 700 adults regularly attended adult-education classes
- Child Rights training: for 170 children, 30 adults, 30 teachers
- Basic psychosocial support and trauma healing training: for 40 teachers
- Peace-building, conflict resolution, human rights & protection issues training: for 457 key individuals
- Peace building workshops: for more than 140 community leaders, women & youth; for religious leaders (the first time for Christian & Muslim leaders together there); for 60 teachers, who learned peace building and teaching methods; for 518 individuals, including peace building and conflict resolution
- 32 women trained to train others in the manufacture & use of fuel-efficient stoves in order to minimize risks of sexual & gender-based violence while collecting firewood
