

Feature Sheet for *We Believe: Faithfully Asking Questions (FAQ) and Faith Questions*

Overview

- *Faithfully Asking Questions (FAQ)* and *Faith Questions* are based on questions collected from young people throughout the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).
- *FAQ* is a quarterly curriculum that is intended for younger youth. *Faith Questions* is available in four- or six-session mini-courses intended for older youth. Both curricula are easily adaptable for broadly graded youth programs.
- Both curricula include an intentional emphasis on spiritual development, recreation, spiritual arts, mission, peacemaking, and justice, as well as connections to movies, music, technology, and other media.

Each Session of Both Curricula Includes:

- Multiple options for learning activities based on multiple intelligence theory
- Significant background information for leaders, including a spiritual reflection for leader
- An overview chart to help the leader organize the session
- Downloadable resource pages
- Session enhancements that include ideas and resources for connecting with families of youth, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), worship, and more!

Faithfully Asking Questions

- Three thirteen-session quarters will be available each year: fall, winter, and spring.
- Each leader's guide is colorful and easy to use.
- Scripture and *The Study Catechism: Confirmation Version* are used to respond to questions collected from young people throughout the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

Faith Questions

- Three new mini-courses (four- or six-sessions each) will be available each quarter for fall, winter, and spring.
- Each mini-course is printed in a 6" x 9" book.
- Scripture and our faith traditions (including the *Book of Order* and *The Book of Confessions*) are used to respond to questions collected from young people throughout the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).
- Each session includes a Coffeehouse Version, which is a one-page, condensed version of the session ideal for use at a simple setting such as a coffeehouse.
