The difference between “spiritual gifts” and talents and abilities”

Gift—When use it I feel refreshed energies

Talent – when give and are drained by it, i.e.: teaching Sunday School may refresh some people or drain others.

The Theology of Gifts

1. God has selected each of us to receive certain spiritual gifts. Paul makes this point quite definitely in Romans 12:6. These special gifts will help you to be in partnership with God.
2. God chooses the gifts given to each of us with perfect knowledge of us. I Corinthians 12:11 makes this clear. God takes into considerations our interests, education, experience, and personality, and God gives us the gifts that “fit” us.
3. God wants each of us to use our gifts. I Corinthians 12:13-27 reminds us that our gifts are needed in the Body of Christ.
4. God has given these gifts to each of us for the purpose of ministry and service. Romans 12:9-21 assures us of this truth.
5. God intends that the work of the church will be accomplished through the gifts given to each person in the church. Ephesians 4:12 reminds us that these gifts are to be used “to build and strengthen” one another in the church.

The Five E's For Exercising Your Spiritual Gifts:

Explore the possibilities

Experiment

Examine your feelings

Evaluate your effectiveness (the fruit of the Spirit)

Expect confirmation from the Body of Christ

Administration: You have been blessed with the gift of understanding clearly the immediate and long-range goals of a committee, working group, or the church as a whole. You are also able to create and carry out effective plans to accomplish these goals. Scripture: I Corinthians 12:28, Acts 6:1-7, Romans 12:8

Arts and Crafts: You have been blessed with the gift of using your hands, imagination and mind in the area of construction, maintenance and upkeep for the benefit and beautification of the Kingdom of God.
Scripture: Romans 12:7, Exodus 31:3-11

Building & Maintenance: You have been blessed with the gift of using your hands, imagination, and mind in the areas of construction, maintenance, and upkeep for the benefit and beautification of the Kingdom of God
Scripture: Romans 12:7, , II Chronicles 34:9-13

Proclaiming the Faith: You have been blessed with the gift of sharing the Good News with others in such a way that these people want to become disciplined Christians.
Scripture: Ephesians 4:11, Acts 13:31-33

Exhortation: You have been blessed with the gift of providing words of comfort, consolation, encouragement and counsel to others.
Scripture: Romans 12:8, I Timothy 4:11-13, Acts 14:21-22

Faith: You have been blessed with the gift of seeing with certain and special confidence what work God wants a person, a committee, a working group or the church as a whole to undertake. You are also able to move forward with the belief that anything is possible through God.
Scripture I Corinthians 12:9, Acts 27:21-25, Hebrews, 11:33-38

Giving: You have been blessed with the gift of contributing your material resources to the work of the Lord with great joy, eagerness and generosity.
Scripture: Romans 12:8, Mark 12:41-44

Helps: You have been blessed with the gift of doing those small, but important behind-the-scenes activities, which are essential to the success of the work of the church.
Scripture: I Corinthians 12:28, Mark 2:3-4

Hospitality: You have been blessed with the gift of providing a warm welcome to others with food, lodging, or personal attention.
Scripture: Romans 12:9-13, Hebrew 13:1-2

Intercession: You have been blessed with the gift of having a disciplined prayer life, which sees frequent and specific answers to your prayers.
Scripture: Romans 12:14-16, James 4:14-16, Acts 12:1-17

Knowledge: You have been blessed with the gift of discovering, accumulating, analyzing, and clarifying information and ideas.
Scripture: I Corinthians 12:8, Romans 15:14

Leadership: You have been blessed with the gift of getting people to work together to accomplish worthwhile goals. Scripture: Romans 12:8, Acts 15:7-12

Mercy: You have been blessed with the gift of showing compassion for those who suffer distressing physical, psychological, or financial problems.
Scripture: Romans 12:8, Luke 10:33-35

Music-Vocal: You have been blessed with the gift of using your voice in the singing of praises and joy to the Lord.
Scripture: Romans 12:7, Colossians 3:16

Music-Instrumental: You have been blessed with the gift of playing a musical instrument in praise of God. Scripture: Romans 12:7, Psalm 150:4-5

Serving: You have been blessed with the gift of identifying the unmet needs of people and doing something to meet those needs.
Scripture: Romans 12:7, II Timothy 1:16-18

Shepherding: You have been blessed with the gift of being responsible for the spiritual well-being of an individual or a small group of people.
Scripture: Ephesians 4:1, I Timothy 3:1-7

Teaching: You have been blessed with the gift of helping children or adults grow spiritually. Scripture: I Corinthians 12:28, Acts 18: 24-28

Wisdom: You have been blessed with the gift of having insight into and understanding of life situations. You also know what to do about them and how to do it. Scripture: I Corinthians 12:8, I Corinthians 2:1-13

Writing: You have been blessed with the gift of putting your thoughts or feelings into words in such a way that people receive courage, guidance, knowledge, or inspiration.
Scripture: Romans 12:7, Acts 15:19-20, Psalms 45:1
